

CLASSES

FLOWER CLASSES

- 1) Three stems of roses – any variety or varieties
- 2) Six stems of sweet peas – any variety or varieties
- 3) Six pansies or violas*
- 4) Three gladioli
- 5) Three stems of flowers of one kind, not classified elsewhere
- 6) One stem specimen hybrid tea rose*
- 7) A vase of annual flowers*
- 8) A vase of three dahlias – of any variety or varieties
- 9) A vase of cottage garden flowers*
- 10) An orchid – growing in a pot*
- 11) One flowering pot plant excluding fuchsias, begonias and orchids*
- 12) One pot of fuchsia (flowers or foliage) *
- 13) One foliage pot plant*
- 14) One pot flowering begonia*
- 15) One pot cactus or succulent*
- 16) A patio container*
- 17) A vase of foliage*

*See Regulation 5
Own container required

OPEN CLASSES – OPEN TO ALL (#)

- 18) Burley Gardeners' Association Tray – a collection of vegetables &/or fruit, a display of three different kinds, two of each kind #
- 19) Burley Gardeners' Association Vase – a vase of mixed flowers, maximum 10 stems & not less than two kinds of flower, to be viewed all-round # # See regulations on back of entry form
- 20) A display of flowers in an unusual container, maximum staging width 60 cm (2ft)
- 21) One stem of one flower with one kind of vegetable
- 22) A single Pelargonium/Geranium in a pot
- 23) A single Coleus grown on from specimen distributed at May meeting

PRODUCE CLASSES

- 24) A Victoria sandwich – raspberry jam filling, caster sugar topping
(three egg mixture baked in two tins)
- 25) Bread – A loaf of bread made in the traditional way (a 1lb bread tin)
- 26) Bread – A loaf of bread, any flavour (machine made)
- 27) A chocolate cake - your own recipe, presented with a copy of the recipe
- 28) A carrot cake - your own recipe, presented with a copy of the recipe
- 29) A round of shortbread
- 30) A fruit pie, maximum 23 cm (9in)
- 31) Four fruit scones
- 32) Four squares of Yorkshire Parkin (NOT ginger cake)
- 33) One jar jam (any fruit) – presented with wax disc & cellophane cover
and label showing type of fruit & date made

WINE CLASSES

Wines should be exhibited in a clear 75cl. (26 fl.oz) bottle with flanged cork or screw cap

- 34) One bottle of dry white wine
 - 35) One bottle sweet white wine
 - 36) One bottle of dry red wine
 - 37) One bottle of sweet red wine
- For Classes 34 – 37 labels must show
type e.g. “Sweet White”, “Dry Red”,
& base ingredient.

HANDICRAFT CLASSES

- 38) A photograph – ‘Seasons – anywhere, anytime’ max. 20cm by 15cm (8in by 6in).
- 39) A photograph – ‘A bird’s eye or worm’s eye view’ max. 20cm by 15cm (8in by 6in).
- 40) A Card for a Special Occasion, max. 25.5cm by 20.5cm (10in by 8in).
- 41) A handcrafted picture, not a photograph or a computer generated or aided image or picture, maximum size 25.5cm by 20.5cm (10in by 8in), excluding mount or frame.

FRUIT and VEGETABLE CLASSES

- 42) A dish of four apples – cooking variety
- 43) A dish of four apples – dessert variety
- 44) A dish of four pears
- 45) Six runner beans
- 46) Three tomatoes (not cherry)
- 47) Six cherry tomatoes
- 48) One cabbage, trimmed, any variety – to be cut by judge
- 49) Three onions – trimmed
- 50) Three courgettes - no more than 15cm (6in)
- 51) Five potatoes – any colour, shape or variety
- 52) One cucumber
- 53) One dish of soft fruit of any variety
- 54) One vegetable marrow – for quality, not weight
- 55) A jam jar of mixed herbs
- 56) One vegetable not specified in any other class, maximum six specimens
- 57) Three beetroot – tops trimmed to no more than 76mm (3in)

NEW CLASSES

For entrants who have not previously won a prize in Flower, Fruit or Vegetable classes.

- 58) One stem of one flower of any kind
- 59) One onion – any size or variety
- 60) Three courgettes – no more than 15cm (6in)
- 61) Three runner beans
- 62) One dish of fruit of any kind

OPEN JUNIOR CLASSES (#)

In each class, prizes will be awarded in three age groups –7 years & under, 8 – 10 and 11 – 16 years. Age, not name, to be shown next to exhibit.

- 63) A photograph – “Partytime”- taken by you, max. 20cm by 15cm (8in by 6in)
- 64 A) A painting – “Flowers” – 7 years and under. Size of paper – A3.
- 64 B) A handwritten & illustrated poem – “The Seed” by Aileen Fisher. 8-10 & 11-16yrs
- 65) Flowers in an unusual container {see regulation sheet or Sprouting Times for copy of poem.}
- 66) A fruit and vegetable vehicle
- 67) Six homemade decorated biscuits (made by you!)
- 68) A birthday card – on A5 card
- 69) Design a First class postage stamp with a gardening theme. 8cm by 10cm (3in by 4in)
- 70) A necklace made from natural materials
